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Spring Term at The Alton

To support and extend their learning, our children have visited Barnes Common, the British Museum, Holly Lodge, Holy Trinity Church, the National History Museum and the Science Museum. Nursery have also had a visit from the London Fire Brigade and explored the fire engine! Next term, our children will be visiting the Barnes Wetlands Centre, Wimbledon Tennis, and Pizza Express. The children in the Woodland Centre, our SEND Resource Base, will be going on a visit to Bockett's Farm.













In English, our Year 4 and 5 children have visited a nearby school to listen to author workshops, and our Year 2 classes have been on a trip to the Polka Theatre. We also offer a selection of after-school clubs. In art club, our children have been enjoying learning how to do origami and sewing.











Pupil Voice is also at the heart of what we do. Many of our children take part in our School Council, Eco-Council and help support other children. Our pupil mental health champion led an assembly inspired by Place2Be's Children's Mental Health Week. Next term, our Year 6 children will be learning about cycle safety with Bikeability workshops. We had great fun celebrating World Book Day, reading our favourite stories and enjoying lots of fantastic costumes. We also celebrated Red Nose Day and raised over £150 for Comic Relief.
